

# How To Find The Curriculum




Step 1 - Go directly to <u>coe22.com</u> and click "RESOURCES" and under Leaders you will click "Group Curriculum."



## Step 2- Scroll down to the current sermon series and click on it.

LEADER NOTES - Leading Well in 7 Minutes or Less: Listen to ALL episodes for free on Spotify or Apple.

Spring trimester: January 13 - May 12 Summer trimester: June 2 - July 28 Fall trimester: August 18 - December 8

Prayer Idea: Provide index cards. Have each member write their prayer requests on a card with their name and place them in the middle of the circle. (If you're a mixed group, separate the cards by sex.) Have each person select a card to pray over for the next week. Encourage members to reach out to the individual they are praying for during the week. Men pray for men; women pray for women.

ANNOUNCEMENTS – Invite a veteran Care Team Member to Your Disciple Group: A short training on what it means to care well for those walking through hard seasons. Our process is modeled after the life of Jesus, who walked shoulder to shoulder with the broken. The Point: God loved so God gave. If you believe, then you receive eternal life.

Share Wins, Praises and Prayers: Where did you see God move this week? What can you share from the action step last week? How did it go? What did you learn about God? About yourself?

Sermon Text: Genesis 22:2; Numbers 21:4-9; John 3:1-21; Romans 8:1; 2 Corinthians 5:21; Galatians 3:13

Action Step: Every morning this week read and meditate on John 3:16. Ask yourself, "Have I fully received the gift of salvation, or am I still trying to achieve it through my actions?" Write down any areas where you are still striving and pray for the Holy Spirit to help you surrender it all to Jesus.

#### Discussion Questions

Leaders: The goal is to grow in our relationship with Christ and each other. It's ok if you don't cover every question.

- Read John 3:1-21. What stood out to you in the sermon this week and what did God reveal to you in the Scriptures, maybe for the first time?
- Nicodemus approached Jesus at night, possibly out of fear or embarrassment. Jesus's response shows God meets us where we are. Share a time you experienced Jesus meeting you right where you were, perhaps in a moment of doubt or worry.
- When do you still feel like you have to do something to be accepted by God?
   (Salvation is received, not achieved. It isn't about what you do but what has been done for you. Jesus did everything necessary for you to be accepted by God.)
- Read John 3:8. What was Jesus trying to get Nicodemus to understand? (God is the initiator. Your
  works are only evidence, like leaves blowing in the wind, that the Spirit is on the move. Jesus appears to
  be saying to Nicodemus, "You don't understand everything about the wind, but you see its effects." That's
  how it is with the birth of the Spirit. You don't have to figure everything out to come to Christ. You have to
  surrender everything to come to Christ.)
- John 1:12 says that those who believe in Jesus's name receive the right to become children of God.
   How does being a child of God shape your identity, choices and obedience?
- What is the main difference between Christianity and all other religions? (All other religions require
  you to earn your way to God. Christianity is the only religion where God sends His son Jesus on a rescue
  mission to save you.)
- What are the similarities and differences in what Abraham was called to do with his son and what God did with His son? (If anyone is unfamiliar with the story, read Genesis 22:1-19.)
- Discover: Read John 3:16. Discuss what each part of that verse means and what stands out to you.
   (Leaders, break it down to discuss, "For God," "so loved," "the world," etc.)
   Deepen: Memorize this verse this week so you're ready to share it when the opportunity arises.
- . Read John 3:19-21. How are we called to be light in a dark world?
- Read Romans 8:1. How can you believe what this verse says? What does it say about the character
  of God?
